



Dear Friends and Co-Laborers.

We pray God will convey our feelings to your hearts as you read this newsletter and see by pictures what you are doing to bring hope to the suffering people in southern Honduras and northern Nicaragua...We know you're anxious to hear of the relief efforts that you have made possible through Good Samaritan Baptist Missions...

In Honduras, we've had no problem so far in buying basic foods (beans, rice, corn, lard, etc.), and literally tons of food have been bought, sacked up and sent out to different areas. Six new lunchrooms have been opened, feeding hundreds of children and adults.

In Nicaragua, we have worked with Brother Santos Casco, our National Director, who in turn has organized pastors' groups to help him buy and distribute food to the thousands there who have been left with nothing. Our Mission actually suffered more material loss in Nicaragua than in Honduras...Many communities were completely washed away...thousands were left without homes. Pastors and their families have been sleeping on the ground, along with hundreds more. Five of our churches were washed away.

Brother Santos has organized work groups...For example, our mission will furnish the materials for re-building. The men in the communities will do the work and be paid in food for their families. Santos says this will give them a sense of pride..they are doing their part and they will be earning their food while working. He will have one group that will make beds; others will make adobes for houses; others roofing. It will be community projects with God, through His people in the United States, supplying the needs. We have seen God work in these days as never before in our lives and our own faith has been strengthened...GOD DOES NOT FORGET HIS PEOPLE. We heard touching stories of how pastors immediately following the hurricane were insulted and humiliated by those in power because they waited in line with others thinking they would be able to get food for their people...THANK GOD WE HAVE SOMEONE HIGHER THAN A GOVERNMENT OFFICIAL WHO PROMISES TO PROVIDE OUR EVERY NEED ACCORDING TO HIS RICHES IN GLORY...And, Oh, how HE is providing...

Brother Santos estimates it will cost approximately \$5,000 to rebuild a rural church; double that amount for town churches. If someone would like to help rebuild a church, what a blessing this would be. These will be brand new communities as the Governments, both in Honduras and Nicaragua, are prohibiting the people from re-building close to a river. In Moralico, Honduras, the Government is giving the people land to re-build and has promised our Mission land for a Church and a Kitchen.


We have been <u>amazed</u> at how God has touched hearts to help us in this Disaster Relief. Churches and people we have never seen have had the confidence to send money, food, clothing, medicine, etc., to Good Samaritan Baptist Missions to help these people. *God bless you is our prayer*. We pray you won't forget these precious people...80% of all the crops are destroyed; they have no place to Work...The Recovery Will Take a Long, Long Time....

We plan to spend most of next year in Honduras...There will be no one here in the U.S. representing the Mission except YOU...Pastors, we would appreciate your recommending us to your pastor friends and let them know what we are doing. We have National Pastors and Bible Institutes that need support. Sponsors, if you are satisfied with the Opportunity of a Lifetime program, talk to your friends about helping a child. The Radio is probably one of the greatest ministries we have to reach the masses with the Gospel and one ministry where we have the greatest need for Support. So, the Needs Are Great, but We Serve a Great God.



kitchen.




This was once the church building and living quarters for Good Samaritan

Ramirez. Manuel and his wife escaped the raging river with his wife tied on boards.






Mayor of Yusguare, Honduras,

Pan-American Highway below boy's dormitory




Good Samaritan Radio Tower




Mauricio pulls a boat with "life-saving" corn across river.

The entire community, including the church and pastorium were washed away.


Sunday Morning, December 13th, we received our first shipments of food, clothing and medicine from the U.S.

What a blessing and what a testimony of our Lord providing for His people as two large Dole Pineapple trucks drove into San Marcos loaded with provisions.

Soon the streets werefilled with people as they witnessed God's blessings. The help to unload was overwhelming.

These first 2 containers were shipped by Jess Stokely of Christian Alliance based in Texas. We thank Mr. Stokely and also a special thanks to Roy Crider and Jim Ishee of Royal Metal Products in Douglasville, Ga. who are so generously supplying their warehouse, containers and doing the shipping of goods from Georgia. Two containers are in the Honduras port now and 2 more are to be shipped next week.




Over 50,000 lbs. Of food was bought in Honduras and divided out to Pastors to be distributed to the needy in the Choluteca area.

A new Feed the Hungry Kitchen was opened in Pillados, Honduras.






In Agua Fria, a mission from the church in El Corpus, many people lost their homes. They are given sacks of food on a regular basis.




167 people are being fed by Pastor Jose Zamora and his wife in El Progreso, Honduras, in a public school house. Women of the church cook the food daily.



People from the mountain area of El Corpus are taking in food that Pastor Efraim has given to them.




Brother Julio

been given food.




New Kitchen in Caire, Honduras




Food Sacks given out in Divisadero


This used to be a small stream coming out of a mountain - a beautiful place...As we made our journey up this mountain we couldn't believe what our eyes were seeing.

That's what Benigno has been doing in this little schoolhouse where we're not only giving beans and rice but he's preaching to these people. Twenty-five have been saved.










These are but a few of the hundreds of Christmas sacks made possible by Opportunity Sponsors.
