

Who would have ever dreamed that a poor girl, raised in poverty, but given an Opportunity of a Lifetime by a Christian family in the United States, would ever be giving a speech in front of dignataries from all over Honduras and Nicaragua - and two PRESIDENTS. God gave Mirna that opportunity and she represented well the testimony of Jesus Christ and the Good Samaritan Baptist High School.



As always, the buildings were filled with people standing. The Gospel is always preached in these services because people come who have never been to church before.



or shoes.


Today, the poor children are in "front of the line" excelling in every area... bringing amazement to their own people.



## New Church Buildings




New church building dedicated in Pillados, Honduras.



Computer graduates and visitors from the U.S. salute the Christian flag as our Christian anthem "Amazing Grace" is sung.




Joan Tyson speaking on behalf of Bob who had to return to the U.S. because of the death of his mother.






"I'll help a poor child in Honduras."






