

Dear Co-Laborers in Christ,

Ministering In

Five full weeks of visitors (including two large groups), Grammar and High School Graduations, Preaching, Baptisms, Weddings, Church and Feed the Hungry Kitchen constructions in several different areas, installing the new tower for Samaritan Radio after the hurricane, and the distribution of six more large containers filled with food and clothing for the disaster victims - all of these things have completely filled our days for the first three months of 1999.

NEW CHURCHES: Several new churches have been raised up in the past three months. In Honduras, the second and third year Bible School students are pastoring in several new mission churches. Over 40 souls were saved in Tapaire, a mission of Divisadero; 15 saved in Conception of Maria, a mission of Jicarito; and several saved in Agua Fria, a new mission of El Corpus. In Nicaragua during the latest evangelistic meeting in the town of Jalapa, over 60 have been saved. They can't find a place large enough to rent for Sunday School so they must meet outside. In Honduras, 45 were baptized in different places in three weeks. Every week there are baptisms in different places. We remember the time when we would see only 15 or 20 saved in a week's meeting, now there are 40 to 60 and they are following the Lord in baptism and are faithful to church. In Duyure, the Police Chief, the Judge and a Religious Leader have all received the Lord.

CONSTRUCTIONS: The new grammar school building is finished (except the back wall and playground area). The *New Elderly Center Is On Its Way Up...* We're all excited about this. There's a new Childrens' lunchroom going up close to the new grammar school. Our church in Divisadero fell in after the hurricane, but we thank the Lord for help to re-build. This construction has started. Several new feeding centers now have roofs - some have sides - but THE CHILDREN ARE EATING.

DISASTER RELIEF: In this newsletter we'll show you a picture of the "model" house that we are building in Nicaragua. There will be 73 houses built like this. We thank God for your generous hearts to help these people who lost everything they had in the hurricane. They are now living under tents. Construction has been delayed because we have had to wait for land on which to build. There is nothing but tons of rocks where their houses once stood. Also, the Government has said no one can re-build next to a river. Little by little we have been able to help buy land and in some cases land has been given. Groups of men from different churches of the mission in Honduras are going for a week at a time to help in the construction. We furnish food while they are building.

RADIO MINISTRY: Samaritan Radio is on the air in Honduras with full power. The new antenna has been installed once again (the other was destroyed in the hurricane)...HOWEVER when the engineer hooked it up, the transmitter began to heat up within two hours, an indication that the electrical power was not strong enough to pull the 6,000 watt transmitter...MORE EXPENSES...We then had to contract with an Electrical Engineer to completely re-run electricity all the way up the mountain - new poles, thicker wire, meter, etc. (everything that goes into running electrical lines). This was an additional cost of over \$12,000 BUT when we went into the back country of Nicaragua everyone was listening to Samaritan Radio. From San Marcos de Colón to Tegucigalpa, the capital city (3 ½ hour journey) you can hear Samaritan Radio all the way. No wonder the devil fights so much against this Radio Network!

FUTURE PLANS FOR SAMARITAN RADIO: We have an opportunity to put in a Repeater Tower in Tegucigalpa, the capital city of Honduras. We have the frequency but if we do not use it- we will lose it and probably would never have the opportunity to buy another frequency because they are so scarce. We have the equipment and land on a mountain to put the tower and transmitter. To go on the air, we need two things: a laser to transmit to the other repeater tower which will cost approximately \$6,000 and secondly we will need to run electricity to the mountain, the same as we had to do in San Marcos, but this will cost more as it is a longer distance...approximately \$16,000. For an investment of \$22,000.00, we will be able to reach millions more with Christian Radio 16 hours per day. What Greater Investment Can One Make...

OUR GREATEST NEED: If you asked us, "What is your Greatest Need?" Our answer would be "Monthly Support for the Radio". Please consider Christian Radio as one of your Mission Projects. Our desire is to saturate Honduras and Nicaragua with the Gospel of Jesus Christ in these last days. We're working on new programming...preachers from the United States, Nicaragua and Honduras; live programs from the churches; chapel services from the schools; Christian interviews; children's programs; prayer programs, etc.

Thank you from the bottom of our hearts for your support, your love and your prayers. Pray for us and COME TO SEE US...


Elderly Center Construction Under Way

A part of the old house is still standing where they are presently being fed.




We thank the Lord for a special donation for the roof.












Here we see hundreds of children in the church at El Naranjal. Every child sat perfectly still waiting on their special Christmas box.








New Church Construction in Pedrenal, Nicaragua






San Marcos de Colón Honduras



Preaching and Baptism from the church in San Francisco, Honduras


