

Tent Meeting El Puente, Honduras

Dear Co-Laborers in Christ,

Once again, it's our blessing to report to you from the mission field in Central America - mainly Hondudras and Nicaragua, but with national missionaries in Costa Rica and Mexico. Due to increase in postage, cost of printing, etc., we are combining our regular newsletter with the national pastors' newsletter, and trust that you will take time to read every word to see what God is doing through Good Samaritan Baptist Missions.

Tent meetings, people saved and baptized, constructions, new school year, and groups coming to visit us...these are just some of the things we have to report. We had five groups back to back - taking one group to the airport and picking up another - but we've had the privilege of meeting some of the finest Christians that we've ever met especially the young people. It was an inspiration to us to see these young people walk in the dust and hot sun, giving out food bags to the suffering people. What better way to exemplify the life of our Lord Jesus than by giving a bag of food in His name to people who have not even lit the fire to cook a meal because there was not one grain of food in the house...children hungry and here comes a group of people who gives them food, and tells them that Jesus loves them and is sending them the food. Mario, our bus driver, told us that people everywhere are now calling the Good Samaritan Mission bus "THE BUS OF BLESSINGS".

Many of the projects we talked about in our last newsletter have now been finished. The new dining hall, kitchen, and the boys' dormitory is beautiful. The remodeling of the dormitory was finished just in time for the arrival of all the boys the Lord sent to us this year - many are coming for the first time. As we now live next door to the boys' dorm, one of our greatest blessings is attending their weekly prayer meetings and hearing God's Word preached by some of our own students. On one particular night, some 10 came forward for salvation. The "Opportunity" students help the "Paying" students (those whom their Honduran parents pay) look up scriptures because many of these new students had never read God's Word. They didn't even know where the book of Genesis was in the Bible but many have been saved since school started in February. What a mission field God has sent our way with all these young people. For the first time since our schools began, we have had to turn away students with the promise they can come next year. Our classrooms are full. We have two and three sections for each grade...in the sixth grade we have 110 students.

Over 100 walked the "old sawdust trail" in the two tent meetings that were held in San Lorenzo and El Puente and received Christ as Savior. The services were filled every night. **What a blessing this tent is.** All of our pastors, far and near, cooperated in these meetings. It took our minds back to the days in Nicaragua when we took the tent from village to village; seeing people saved and churches raised up.

**Comali Tabernacle Construction...**The floor is two-thirds of the way being laid and next the windows will be installed. We have seen these and they are beautiful, colored windows. We have been given the following budget for these windows:

31 at \$65.00 each = \$2015.00 12 at \$100.00 each = \$1200.00 8 at \$55.00 each = \$440.00 TOTAL = \$3655.00

One of our visitors to Honduras gave us a good idea...What if 51 people furnished a window for this tabernacle? We are putting this need before you. Maybe someone could buy more than one. If more than 51 people respond, we have so many more needs - such as pulpit, benches or chairs, etc., etc. We have always put the need before God's people and you have responded. When this tabernacle is completed it will be a building that will bring honor and glory to our Lord. Sitting there on the Pan American highway, with a cross at the top that lights up at night, it

has attracted the attention of many people. They stop to ask what this building is - even our builder says he knows of no other building designed like this in all Honduras. **Our God Deserves the Best...This Place Is His.** Years ago when our son, Philip, bought this land, he called it "Land for Jesus". Well, it has turned out to be just that. When the tabernacle is finished, we will begin construction on the rooms for the Bible Institute. This year, we have over 50 preachers studying in Nicaragua and Honduras. Next year, the Lord willing, they will study together at the Tabernacle on the Land for Jesus.

We have other constructions going on all over Honduras and Nicaragua. We thank the Lord for people who want to share their material blessings so that people can have a building in which to worship our Lord.

People continue to receive the Lord through the Radio Ministry. Only eternity will reveal the people who have received the Lord through this ministry. Fifteen calls have been received from Costa Rica saying they heard Samaritan Radio - we really don't know how far this radio is reaching now with the increase in power.


The newspapers have been filled with appeals for help from the Governments for the starving people in Central America due to the drought. There has been no rain since last November, and even before that, there was not much rain. The Good Samaritan Baptist Missions is doing everything we can to feed the children through our many lunchrooms scattered throughout Honduras and Nicaragua. Next month, the Lord willing, we will be opening a new feeding center in the town of Concepción de Maria...Thank you wonderful people for supporting this ministry.

Last Sunday, there were over 50 of our elderly in Sunday School and at the end of the service they presented the pastor with \$12.00 to go on the construction of the pastorium that the church in San Marcos is building. I thought of the widow's mite - she gave all she had and the Lord saw this...These old people had been saving their money and they proudly brought it to the church so they could have a part in the pastor having a house to live in. *May God Help Us to Give out of Our Necessity and Not Our of Our Abundance.* 

May God bless everyone of you. If we had all the time and space in the world, we still couldn't say thank you enough. We love everyone of you.



in Nicaragua.




Bro. Jorge Rizo, who has been a pastor with Good Samaritan Baptist Missions for over 30 years, brought a message under the tent.












Twenty-one souls were baptized by Pastor Luis Pastrana in El Triunfo, Honduras.






Children received Vacation Bible School certificates in the Philadelphia Baptist Church in Costa Rica, where Brother Graciano Urbina is pastor.

#### Manuel Chavarria, El Corpus Saved 11 Baptized 6 We've received the wonderful news that the Lord is giving us a new temple in this place. Santiago Colindres, Duvure Saved 18 A group of men from the church built a small house for a poor family who had no place to live. Many cooperated in this and we all felt good in our hearts. We had a wedding in the church with some 600 people in and around the church. This was a great testimony in this town. Also we had the Feast of the First Fruits in December and every member brought to the church an offering of what God had given him. There were testimonies of what God had done for every member and then a supper - the presence of the Lord was felt. Oscar Valleio, El Puente Saved 9 Many lost people are visiting the church. Luis Alonzo Pastrana, Azacualpa Saved 9 Baptized 2 I have been carrying rocks in my truck for the foundation of our third church. A lot of men are saved here and they are all helping and working. We've had people saved and baptized. We've also had weddings. Benigno Rodriguez, Yusquare Baptized 5 Saved 35 I preached in the tent meeting and thirty were saved. Also I baptized three in Las Pitas and two in Los Tablones. Federico Canales Osorto, Danli Saved 22 We held a campaign in a new area where the Gospel had never been preached. Fifteen souls were saved. Soon there will be marriages and baptisms in this place. Ronald Antonio Martinez, Choluteca Saved 22 A new mission camp has been raised up with two saved. Four were saved this month in the church and two were reconciled. I was invited to preach in a restaurant and I preach twice in the prison. Carlos Ordoñez, El Triunfo Sayed 9 We have an average of 200 children in Sunday School. Jose Donaldo Aguilera, Tapaire Saved 11 In Tapaire, God has saved souls...three adults and eight children. Jose Carmen Carcamo, Choluteca Saved 28 Baptized 6 The police gave us permission to block the main street in one of the neighborhoods in San Jeronimo. Even though some of the people got mad because the road was blocked, some 200 heard the Gospel. Two received Christ. Twenty were saved in an evangelistic campaign; three have been saved in the church and six baptized. I preached in Managua, Nicaragua in my homeland. Victor Maldonado, San Lorenzo Saved 85 Some 70 people were saved in the tent meeting. Now we have a great work today taking care of these babies in Christ. Many of these came on buses and trucks from other churches of our mission. Therefore all the pastors have work to do. Ronmel Gomez, El Naranjal Saved 6 Four very religious men came to the feet of Jesus. Roman Antonio Martinez, Divisadero Saved 7 Seven have been saved and two couples were married. A young man from our church will study in the Bible Institute this year. Pedro Estrada, San Francisco Saved 3 We thank the Lord for our new kitchen to feed the children and Bro. Neal Anderson who is helping us to build this new Jose Rene Linarez, Filadelfia Baptist, El Carmen Saved 4 On May 4, I will be getting married. My fiancee's name is Ondina.
