Dear Co-Laborers in Christ,

The first three months of the year are always our busiest and the year 2004 has not been an exception. All of our schools began again in February with the highest enrollments we have ever had. Every seat in our high school auditorium is filled and some students sitting around the walls...it is a beautiful sight to see 600 young people hearing God's Word preached. The grammar school is packed out with hundreds of precious children, all dressed up in their new shoes, pretty blue and white uniforms, and backpacks filled with all their school supplies, ready to begin a new school year. They love Jesus because HE is SO GOOD to them, giving them everything they need so they will be able to receive a good education and one day be able to work and help their parents. What a wonderful program the Lord has given us to not just help these children and young people physically but to have them under the sound of the Gospel every day.

Our Bible Institute also began again with fifteen new students in their first year. The first week was "work" week and what a blessing to see over 50 students, along with their teachers, working around the Institute - some preparing the fields for planting beans and corn; others working on the grounds; others cleaning...but everyone is happy to be back again to study God's Word. This Bible Institute has been another MIRACLE OF GOD. When we started last year, we had no money to help these preachers, buy the food, and run this Institute...BUT the Lord, as He always does, has touched many, many hearts to help us. We have new students this year—and we are putting this need once again before you for support for these preachers and for this Institute. We need \$100.00 for a single student and \$150.00 to help a married student, so they will be able to feed their families while they are away studying the Bible. 1) Several sponsors may support one student or 2) one sponsor may want to pay the full sponsorship, 3) or you may want to mark your support "Bible Institute"...This will help us to buy the food, pay cooks, utilities, etc.

In January, we went through a very sad experience with Pastor Antonio Suarez, pastor in Santa Mira and also a third year student, who lost his baby girl, only 14 months old. The little girl had dysentery, was vomiting and had a high fever, but had gotten better. Brother Antonio went to help on a church construction and her fever went up again. She died as the mother was taking her to the hospital. Over 30 pastors from our mission was with Brother Antonio and his wife all night and at the funeral the next day... It was very sad, but this precious family testified of their faith in the Lord Jesus and that one day they will see their daughter again.

In February, we had an opportunity to visit our two Christian schools in Nicaragua. In Condega, we have 166 students enrolled and 199 students in La Trinidad. I don't think we saw a student who wasn't smiling and so happy to be able to go to a Christian school.

There have been so many professions of faith during this new year; also marriages and baptisms. We don't have time to report on everyone but this one in particular is such a blessing. In the village of Los Mangos, (not far from San Marcos) an elderly man, 88 years old, and his companion, 76 years old, had been living together for 56 years when they heard the Gospel and received the Lord. Their desire was to be married legally. After the civil wedding, Pastor Ramon Aguirre from San Marcos, performed the Christian ceremony in their little hut where hundreds gathered outside to witness the change that has taken place in the hearts of these dear people. They will be baptized in the creek just as soon as the weather warms up. During a Saturday morning service, in this same village, a man and his sister were saved. This man's companion was saved several months before and immediately she and the church began praying for him, and on this Saturday morning the Holy Spirit broke his heart. Now they will be married and baptized - another testimony of the power of the Gospel to change not only individual lives, but entire communities and villages. We have seen both fathers and their sons get married at the same time, with their children and grandchildren witnessing the power of the Gospel in their lives.

As always, many of the new students coming in to our high school are not saved - some have never heard the Gospel, and already several have received the Lord. Please pray for these young people. They go back to very "religious" homes but homes that have never had a Bible and know nothing about salvation. Pray these young people will be a testimony to their parents and the rest of their families and friends.

The new radio tower has been installed in the city of Comayagua, on the highway leading to the north of Honduras. This is the most populated state in Honduras, with over one million people. The transmitter has been ordered from the United States, and we plan to be on the air in this large city in a couple of months.

We are thanking the Lord for the wonderful response we have received on the need for a ceiling in the Comali tabernacle. We never cease to be amazed at how God always takes care of every need. We know HIS hand is upon the work of Good Samaritan Baptist Missions, and we thank Him and we thank you for all you are helping us to do. We hope to see many of you in Honduras this year - already over 20 groups are booked to visit Honduras and Nicaragua. We need your prayers that God will give us the strength, wisdom and courage to face whatever may come our way. We love everyone of you in the Lord and we thank you for everything you are doing to help us in this work.

This little church is bursting at the seams with people. There's a great need here to enlarge and add Sunday School rooms. In the rainy season there is no place for the children to have classes.




Rio Abajo, Nicaragua Pastor Sergio Lopez






Pastor Carmen Carcamo baptized new believers in a new work called Guayamaca, Honduras.

- 2) Below is a mission work from the church in Somoto. It would take \$10,000.00 to build a church here in the back country.




