



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It brings me great joy to tell you that on June 26, 2004, Samaritan Radio Network went on the air in the state of Comayagua, Honduras. The challenge set before us in August of 2003 has now been accomplished. Though, just two weeks ago, right before we were supposed to go on the air, the radio station was attacked strongly by the "religious" leaders here in Tegucigalpa. Even more obstacles were placed before us so that our radio station would not be able to reach the northern parts of Honduras. There is a "religious" station that reaches all of Honduras and the only difference between us and them was the NORTH. I feared this situation many months ago when this project was starting but I never lost faith knowing that this is God's Work and He is in control of every situation and the different circumstances that we might confront.


Our fourth Radio Marathon was being held at this same time, where over sixty pastors came united with one common goal in mind ... to have constant prayer so that we might overcome the obstacles that had been placed before us. In just nine days the battle was won, but, even more importantly, a greater bond was felt between the pastors of our mission, knowing that we needed each other perhaps more than ever to be able to overcome these great obstacles.

I would like to thank every church and individual that had a part in this project because we are a team working together trying to reach as many souls for Christ as possible. As you can see in these pictures, God has given us great equipment to work with, and the outreach of our radio stations is now six million people throughout Central America. 



Dear Friends and Co-Laborers,

All of us are rejoicing over the victory won in the new Radio Station...Many, many months of work and prayer have gone into this new station and just when we thought everything was ready, the devil made his final attack. Thank the Lord the victory is ours through our Lord, Jesus Christ. More than a million more people will now have an opportunity to hear the Word of God over this new station in Comayagua, Honduras. If you're thinking about taking on a new mission project, please consider Samaritan Radio Network. This is a very expensive ministry but who can put a price on a soul?

It's hard to know where to start this newsletter... There is TOO MUCH NEWS to put in one letter so we'll try to put as many pictures as we can. The Lord has saved so many people here and we've had weddings, baptisms, new church constructions, new Feed the Hungry kitchens and *groups, groups, groups*. What a blessing all of these groups are but we must admit we are all a little tired. Next week will be a week of rest from groups but a time to do some serious letter writing and bookkeeping.

We have been on roads in the back countries of Nicaragua and Honduras where it should be against the law for a big bus to travel – but God was with us and has given us protection. This last week we were in a church service and had baptisms in Susucayan, Nicaragua. One of our Bible Institute students, Brother Hernan Blandon, pastors here. We had never taken an American group to this far-away place but it was a blessing for all of us. After this service, we went back even further to a place called Limon de Jalapa to visit another church. We crossed little narrow bridges that I never thought the bus would be able to cross. As we neared the very last bridge, we couldn't believe our eyes – the little cement bridge had fallen in. So everyone got off the bus and began to pile rocks in the holes but, in spite of this, our bus got stuck. So...all the men began to push. I began to walk up the hill, not wanting to see what was happening to our bus, but at last it came out and we were on our way – everyone was happy and rejoicing! We have had some wonderful groups – how we thank the Lord for sending people here to not only take on projects and help the work but to encourage us and to encourage our national preachers.

It is a miracle what God is doing here in Honduras and Nicaragua. With Bob's illness and our being unable to visit churches in the United States to raise money for the work, God is doing it for us. He is sending more people to us than we could possibly visit on deputation, and as we look around and see all that HE is doing, it humbles us and makes us realize even more that this is HIS WORK!! He has raised this work up not only to be a blessing here in Central America but a blessing to everyone from the United States who comes to visit.

Thank you for your support; thank you for responding to our urgent needs; thank you for your prayers! We love you from the bottom of our hearts. 

La Palagua, Bro, Paul made it possible for these dear people to have a bigger and better church building.



Bob Tyson taught them many years ago about giving the Lord the tithe of their first fruits and so many of the churches practice this twice a year at their harvests. We were privileged to be at La Palagua 2 years ago when they brought in chickens, pigs, vegetables, fruits and corn – they call this "Tithes of the First Fruits."

There's a spirit of revival in the Mt. Calvary Baptist Church in San Marcos de Colón, Honduras. Many souls have been saved and on one particular Sunday, 28 were baptized.

This was such a special baptism because so many elderly people were baptized.



Some were so feeble they had to be held.

One person remarked that this was the only baptism where he had shed tears.



Remember the elderly couple I told you about in an earlier letter, Bro. Modesto and Sister Petrona, who had been living together for 56 years without matrimony when they received the Lord? He was 88 and she was 76 years old. They received the Lord; were married and in the picture above are being baptized. They're always in church and a testimony for the whole village.

Most of our new churches are started under a roof or shed, as you can see from this picture.

There are several saved and there are close to 100 children coming to Sunday School.



Five were baptized on the day we were here in this beautiful river close to the church. Joining this shed is a house that used to be a cantina—the church is now renting. This house and land can be bought for \$6000. Later as the funds are available, we could have a pretty church here.





<u>Mission</u> <u>Campground Near</u> <u>Palacaquina,</u> <u>Nicaragua</u>

The campground is a project of our national pastors in Nicaragua, who bought this land and built 2 or 3 little crude cabins for the young people of their churches.



We had the privilege and blessing of visiting here for a baptismal service with several of the Nicaragua churches.

The people came in on big trucks, vans, horses – and some walked, such as what we did for quite a ways.

Eighteen believers followed the Lord in baptism in some of the muddiest and dirtiest water we had ever seen but no one seemed to mind. Bro. Ronnie Vice, pastor of Grace Baptist in Tifton, GA had the privilege of baptizing these new Christians.

The pastors gave us a budget of \$8500 on things of necessity before the camp can be usable; including a generator for electricity and more cabins for the young people.

It was such a blessing to have Darwin and his family with us for two weeks, translating for the groups and seeing what God is doing in his life.















Groups

Bro. Willie Pinder was talking to Br. Bob at the special Mother's Day program at the Elderly Center.




Bro. Willie's granddaughter, Summer, and a member of Peoples Church in Spanish Wells, Bahamas served the Elderly.




This group gave out food door to door.

This group tried to repair the bridge that had fallen in on our way to Limon de Jalapa, Honduras.




The hard work of this "Road Crew" just wasn't good enough and so the bus finally had to be pushed out.


