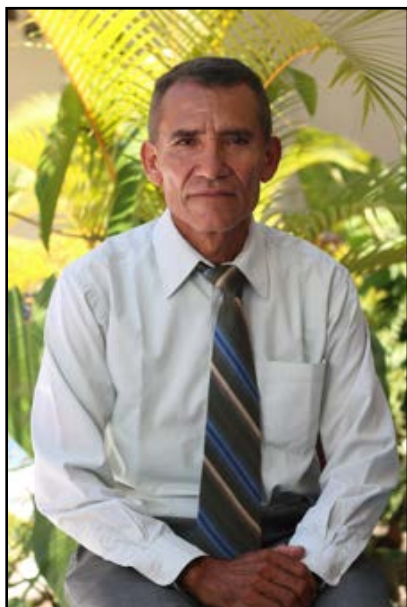


“We have been having discipleship classes with our new believers. This has been a blessing because it is helping them to grow in their faith!”

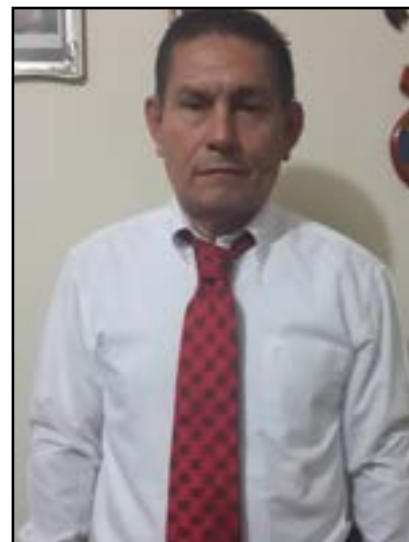
